Thoddn: The strange-looking "b"

Pronounced like a very soft thas in Theodore. Most often at the beginning of a word, but in this song, a few times at the end.

G/g Most often at the beginning of the word or followed by R, it will be hard. Words with the soft G seem somewhat like the soft -ich ending in German (sort of like a cat hiss)

Words with hard G: Words with hard G at end are pronounced almost like a K

Gæt One word has a medium G-pronounced like the G in "linger"

Soft G words found in lines 5 and 6, and repeated later on:

Ég pronounced yegh. Soft q. should have an accent over the é. "ég á" is

Pronounced "yegh ow"

R/r Always rolled, with the tongue behind the top teeth and air coming out both

sides of the tongue. It's very soft.

Hvers pronounced Kvehrs or like the kv sound in keine <u>qual</u>=qvall

ð In Icelandic it's called Edth

(approximate spelling)

Words with ð: pronounced extremely softly and you "spread it out"
